

Come join us for a hands-on exploration of the life and crafts of the past with Folk Family Fun! Start at the very foundations when you put together a child-sized log cabin, and build your way up to stitching "clothes" and following animal tracks. Work together to weave a basket, take time to explore the barnyard, and pick up a paintbrush to see what your creative spirit can reveal! Whether you're good at spotting all the different plants on the trail or the puzzle of putting together a quilt, you'll find something to spark your curiosity. Of course kids will love the return of the perennial favorite, panning for gold at our sluice! The summer will also include a weekly folk art class for rising 1st-6th graders accompanied by an adult, where they get to delve deeper into a skill and take home their work. With stations throughout the park geared for kids aged 3-11, this fun summer activity will show the whole family that the past can still teach us something new!

# Nature Rangers Camp: Tales, Tails & Trails

This spring break, March 26-30, children in kindergarten through 5th grade will love Tales, Tails, and Trails! Come join us as we learn about different folk tales from around the world and close to home and meet the animals that inspired some of those stories. No camp at Burritt would be complete without a hike on our forested nature trails! Come make new friends, play games, create crafts, and enjoy the great outdoors as only you can at Burritt on the Mountain.

Each day, campers will be led by our trained, CPR-certified staff and will receive plenty of individualized attention due to our low teacher to camper ratio of 1:15. Camp days run from 9:00 to 2:00. Students should bring their own sack lunch, but Burritt will provide a snack each day. You may also choose to register for our extended day options with drop-off available as early as 7:45 a.m. and pickup as late as 5:30 p.m. The cost for each day of extended day is an additional \$5 each day for morning only, an additional \$10 each day for afternoon only, or \$15 each day for both morning and afternoon.



To better fit busy families' schedules, we offer three attendance options. Campers may join us for all five days (26th-30th) at a cost of \$155 for members and \$165 for nonmembers. Can't make it for the whole week? Come to camp Monday through Wednesday (26th-28th) at \$93 for members and \$99 for nonmembers, or come Thursday and Friday (29th & 30th) at \$62 for members and \$66 for nonmembers.
