Mansion Exhibit: ()uilts from our Collections

For over 60 years Burritt Museum has become the home to a unique collection of quilts. A selection of our quilts will be on display May 8, 2018- January 6, 2019 in the Burritt Mansion. Dates of when the quilts were made range from early 1800s to the 1930s. Some of the quilts are of local significance while others are a wonderful example of the skill and labor and love that went into making these works of art. One quilt was made by Ellen Steele Tracy, daughter to famed architect George Steele and another quilt is from the Jones-Criner families. Be sure to also notice the quilts in the cabins in the Historic Park. While most of the quilts in the park are historic reproductions, they are still beautiful and a testament to the handwork and skill of this age-old traditional craft.
