

2021 Nature Rangers Summer Camp at Burritt on the Mountain

Burritt camps are back to provide your child with a summer full of learning and laughter! These camps are open to children who are <u>rising</u> 1st-6th graders and are led by Burritt's CPR-certified staff. Our teacher to camper ratio of 1:12 ensures that your child receives individualized attention during these fun-filled days of crafts, games, hiking, nature exploration and more. Please be sure to register your child for the correct camp based on grade level. Each camp has a section for rising 1st, 2nd and 3rd graders that is designated as a "Junior Rangers" camp. The other section is for children who are rising 4th, 5th, and 6th graders and is a "Rangers" camp. Please note that Junior Rangers GeoQuest Explorers is offered on a different week from Rangers GeoQuest Explorers for older children. All other camps have both sections offered on the same week.

Camp days run from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm. Students should bring their own sack lunch, but Burritt will provide a snack each day. You may also choose to register for our extended day options with drop-off available as early as 7:30 a.m. and pick-up as late as 5:30 p.m. The cost for extended day is an additional \$10 each day for morning only, an additional \$20 each day for afternoon only, or \$30 each day for both morning and afternoon.

At Burritt on the Mountain we are following CDC guidelines for COVID-19 protocols. Children <u>must</u> bring a mask that fits properly to camp each day. We will be wearing masks when we are indoors and anytime that we do not think that we can ensure that social distancing can be maintained. The number of campers in each section has been reduced to ensure that we can follow spacing guidelines.
